Newlyweds Elizabeth Taylor and Eddie Fisher even spent their honeymoon at the beautiful property escaping their busy city life.

In 2017, GrayBarns saw yet another metamorphosis. Bought and renovated into its present state by The Glazer Group, it's now the perfect combination of modern elegance with a touch of rustic country, and has all the makings of a romantic New England weekend getaway. The properties six luxurious king suites boast the original post and beam structure and wide board oak floors, truly holding on to its original splendor.
